
It would be helpful to pop a wee note inside saying you want your money to go to the shoebox appeal as the Samaritan's Purse people have many projects.



## Growing Young at Cadder

Cadder Church has partnered with Growing Young – a Church of Scotland initiative to help churches reimagine their culture so that they are more likely to be a place where people under 30 will want to belong, participate, and this become a truly intergenerational church.

Growing Young has grown out of Fullerton Youth Institute in California who spent four years identifying common features among congregations in the US that were attracting and retaining teenagers and young adults and thus became intergenerational. They've developed a programme to help other congregations who want to embrace the core principles and apply them to their own context.

The principles are...

Giving young people leadership responsibility

Empathising with young people

Focusing on Jesus' message

Cultivating warm relationships

Making young people a priority in everything

Being good neighbours locally and beyond.

Cadder has formed a team that is on a year long mission of discovering more about their church and how we can bridge the gaps between our youth and our church and apply the principles to our church life. There are over 20 Church of Scotland congregations who are part of this exciting project. Our team meets monthly with those other teams from those congregations and also staff from Fullerton Seminary and experienced Church of Scotland leaders. We believe that the church has a future and that young people of all ages will play an important part in this. Please pray for this initiative.
