

# A View from the Manse

Dear Friends,

After the great fire of 1666 that levelled London, the world's most famous architect, Christopher Wren, was commissioned to rebuild St Paul's Cathedral. One day in 1671, Christopher Wren observed three bricklayers on a scaffold, one crouched, one half-standing and one standing tall, working very hard and fast. To the first bricklayer, Christopher Wren asked the question, "What are you doing?" to which the bricklayer replied, "I'm a bricklayer. I'm working hard laying bricks to feed my family." The second bricklayer, responded, "I'm a builder. I'm building a wall." But the third brick layer, the most productive of the three, when asked the question, "What are you doing?" replied with a gleam in his eye, "I'm a cathedral builder. I'm building a great cathedral to The Almighty."

Let me get straight to the point! The Church needs you! It needs your God given talents to build God's Kingdom! We are in very challenging times and the Church of Scotland is being tested. Congregations across the National Church are being reduced and ministries are being cut – partly due to finance, fewer members, and the increasing challenges from our increasingly material and secular world. Rev Prof Doug Gay of Glasgow University wrote, that numerically, the Church of Scotland is losing one average sized congregation each week.

Our local ministry allocation will also change to two ministers for our three churches in Bishopbriggs. So, you can see that everything is being stretched. The Church needs your support today more than ever! We need Kingdom builders!

Jesus called people to come and join him in the building of God's Kingdom. He told the story about three men (Matthew 25 v 14-30) who were each given talents. The men were told to go and use them. One had five talents, he made five more, one had two talents and he returned another two, one was given one talent and he went and buried it. When his Master returned, he presented his one talent to the Master and his Master was very angry and asked the question, "Why did you not go and use it or even invest it!", and the man with one talent said that "he was afraid of his Master". The Master immediately took his talent from him and also all his privileges and he was shut out of the Kingdom.

The story of the talents is to encourage us all to use our God given talents in the building of God's Kingdom. I am grateful to the many folks who already use their talents at Cadder Church, however there is a place for every one of us and so I invite you all to come and play your part in building God's Kingdom here at Cadder Church; don't be afraid! there is a place for you to serve, contact me, and let us discuss where that place might be.

Our teams are wide ranging, and there will be an opportunity for you to shine, so come and serve Jesus by being part of the work of his Kingdom.

Lent is a time to reflect on how Jesus lay down his life for the Kingdom and that he calls us also to take up our crosses and join him in building his Kingdom here on earth.

# Property

The Property Team is responsible for ensuring the Church buildings which includes both the North and South Halls as well as the Church and Manse are kept in good repair and well maintained.

Over the past few months we have been carrying out jobs such as upgrading the taps in the South hall to be lever action taps making them easier for all users, general maintenance e.g. light bulb replacement, removal of leaves at the South and North Hall and ensuring heating boilers are serviced annually. In addition overseeing more major jobs like the removal of the chimney at the Manse which was causing dampness in the Manse.

In the North Hall the installation of an intruder alarm has commenced and the current fire alarm and detector heads will be upgraded. We are also in the process of replacing the vinyl to the kitchen, all the above will be completed by the end of March.

The team has also contacted some specialist Stonemasons to carry out repairs to the pillar at the vestry door at the church which has suffered some damage.

Other projects that we will be undertaking in the coming months are, replacement of the North Hall gutter, refurbish sliding doors in North Hall.

As the weather improves there will be more outdoor jobs like ground maintenance around all our buildings. This is where we will be looking for additional help so watch this space!

Property team members along with a few other members of the Session are looking into the development of the South Hall and how the South Hall could be improved to best meet the need of current and future users.

### Caring for Creation

Our first few months of the year have largely been about getting organised and picking up on our first quarters programme.

Following our first open meeting on 23 February on the theme of “Bogs and Bats”, we have built and erected 6 Bat boxes in the trees around Cadder Wharf and the Church Car Park.

A recurring theme throughout this year is “Plant a Tree in 23” and we have already had some of our Girls’ Brigade and Boys’ Brigade girls and boys helping the Rangers plant around 200 trees in Bishopbriggs Park. This was followed by some of our members help plant 4 to 5 year old Cherry and Oak trees in Meadowburn Park.

We encourage all in the congregation to plant at least one tree this year and let us know about it.

Through the recycling boxes at the Church and South Hall, we have raised around £70 for Christian Aid by recycling Ink Cartridges, and large number of spectacles have been passed over to Vision Aid.

On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> March, we will be holding an Earth Hour Service at Cadder Wharf and then the Church between 8.30 p.m. and 9.30 p.m. Everyone will be encouraged to switch off all electricity and heating in their house. Either walk to the canal or park at the North Hall and walk down if you are able and bring a torch. More details to follow nearer the time.

Also towards the end of March we will be distributing Wildflower seeds to all the young people in the church and the youth organisations as well as the congregation to plant in their gardens or nearby open space. Bees, insects, moths, and butterflies are key pollinators for plant life and also for humans who benefit from plants providing food and medicines so it's important we that we try to halt the decline of these important creatures.

There are some other new ventures in the pipeline and we will pass out information via the weekly Intimations and future Gazette articles.
