

CADDER GROWTH PLAN 2025

Here at Cadder Church, the work of our Growth Plan commits us to build the house of the Lord on the Church of Scotland's 5 Marks of Mission; 5 marks which are grounded in the life of Jesus, and in the early church. Jesus came to **TELL** people about God's love and mercy; he came to **TEACH** people how to live in a loving community; he came to **TEND** the sick and the weak; He came to **TRANSFORM** unjust structures; he came to **TREASURE** God's people and world and give us the vision of His coming Kingdom, when his creation will be restored. The full Cadder Growth Plan for 2025 can be found on our church website.

We have 12 teams working to deliver the Growth Plan. Elsewhere in the Gazette you can find out what the teams have been doing in recent months and some of their plans for the months ahead. They are working hard to sustain and build the life of our church. As we go through a time of change it is good to have a plan!

We are now half way through the 5 year plan for Cadder Growth. In May 2025, convenors, team leaders and some Kirk Session members met up to reflect on how things have been going. We were able to identify a number of positives as well as a number of challenges. Much has been achieved but it was agreed that there are things which we could do better. We discussed options for improving how the Growth structure works, including: (1) how teams collaborate in the planning and delivery of activities; (2) communication between the teams; and, (3) more effective engagement with the congregation to build support and widen involvement in Growth work.

Good communication is always a challenge in a period of change but we know better communication will be key to growing the church. It is intended that we bring this group together again in the autumn to help shape planning for next year, taking on board the range of suggestions gathered from the May meeting.





The summer period has been a very busy one for the team running events to mark the bi-centenary of the current building of Cadder Church. August alone saw three significant events in the programme.

Special Bi-Centenary Service

What a memorable occasion this was!

We were honoured by the presence of the Moderator of the General Assembly, Rt. Rev. Rosemary Frew, who was the guest preacher, and George Mackay, the Moderator of Glasgow Presbytery.

There was a real buzz around the church, with fantastic singing. Ten former probationers and students who did placements at Cadder came from all around the country, from the Highlands to the Borders, to speak at the service.

Each spoke movingly of how their future ministry was shaped under the tutelage of past ministers Revs Graham Finch and John MacGregor and the late Jack Beaumont.

Amongst them was Will Storrar, who did a placement at Cadder in 1984 and went on to become a distinguished professor, theologian and author.

After the service the Moderator commented:

'It was a wonderful celebration of the life and impact of a congregation''. Meanwhile, former ministry student Rev. Neil Glover, an ex-committee convener in the Church of Scotland, added:

"Thank you so much for a really encouraging evening. Just as some hospitals are regarded as teaching hospitals, it is obvious that Cadder is a teaching congregation". The service was recorded and can be viewed on the Cadder Church channel on YouTube. There is also an article in the news section of the Church of Scotland website.

After the summer break the Shop and Coffee Shop reopened on Wednesday 13th August. We look forward to welcoming both regular and new customers to enjoy a drink and our delicious range of home baking. We

Because of commitments, and other activities in the autumn we are unfortunately unable to participate in the Community Council's Christmas lights switch-on event this year. We will however see a return of our own **Shops Open Day**, which will be held on Saturday 25th October from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. In addition to a selection of charity Christmas cards and gifts from our own shop we plan to have other stallholders with a wide range of gifts suitable for Christmas. selected by the volunteers in 2022 & 2023. The charities were - Parkinson's UK, Alzheimer Scotland, Prostrate Scotland and Duchenne UK (muscular dystrophy). Each received £1,300.

Thanks to all the customers and volunteers who have supported

the shops, and hence these charities, in recent years.

You can see from the above that there is still a lot of activity associated with the Coffee Shop and Shop. None of this could happen without our dedicated volunteers. We are ever grateful to the volunteers, for their contribution to the running of the Shop and Coffee Shop and for the contribution they make to providing a place of welcome and fellowship for Cadder members and the wider community.
